12-hour Solo Cycle in support of PTSD Awareness



Help Us Help Board Member and Veterans' Program Director, Andrew Potichnyj, cycled solo for 12 hours non-stop (7am - 7pm) on Sunday, June 27, 2021! A huge thank you to all of our supporters who helped us raise \$48,205! Help Us Help is extremely grateful to our top donors, Dr. Marie Bountrogianni and The Ihnatowycz Family Foundation.

Post-Traumatic Stress Disorder (PTSD) Awareness Day is recognized annually on June 27 In the week leading up to his 12-hour cycle on June 27th, Andrew raised funds for Help Us Help Programming that supports veterans and other vulnerable populations in Ukraine, many of whom are living with PTSD.

Much of Help Us Help's programming is designed to help veterans and members of other vulnerable populations in Ukraine manage symptoms of PTSD and other disorders, and learn how to cope with past trauma. Our mission is to ultimately provide the tools, training and resources to enable them to become fully contributing members of society.

Veterans' Program Research Project

This Summer, Help Us Help conducted a research project evaluating the programming that we support through Veteran Hub. The research project consisted of a literature review, evaluating global trends in veteran support, and interviews with veterans and support staff at Veteran Hub. The purpose of the study was to evaluate the effectiveness of the programming we support in Ukraine and to identify areas of improvement.



Third "Mobile Support Services Vehicle"

We are so excited to announce that, thanks to the generosity of our donors, Help Us Help is able to work wth Help Us Help UA to purchase a third vehicle to support this program that is carried out in partnership with Veteran Hub and IREX Ukraine. This third vehicle will provide support services in the **Dnipropetrovsk region** of Ukraine. Through our "Christmas Wish Campaign" we will continue supporting all three Mobile Support Programs in all three regions!





Mobile Support Services for
Veterans is a program that allows a
professional support team,
composed of a psychologist, a
lawyer, and a case manager, to travel
to remote areas in Ukraine. This
team provides veterans with
psychological, legal, case
management, and employment
support. The program targets
veterans and their families who
cannot physically travel or who live
in remote areas, and consists of
three stages.

- Stage one: Assessing the needs and living conditions of the veterans as well as providing them with information about opportunities available through this program
- Stage two: Determining how to provide the identified veterans and their families with personalized support
- <u>Stage three</u>: 8 months of consistent delivery of personalized support and community building activities.

Andrew Potichnyj, Help Us Help Veterans' Committee Chair, will be travelling to Ukraine in the near future to be present when the keys of the third vehicle are handed-off to the Veteran Hub professional support team!

Second Annual Independent Move-A-Thon

Over the course of two weeks, teams composed of community members in both Canada and Ukraine participated in a variety of activities to fundraise for Help Us Help's programming for vulnerable populations of Ukraine. Along with the individual volunteers, children from the Khoruzhivka Centre located in the Sumy oblast, and children in the Ternopil Residential School both took part in this initiative and participated in a day full of fun activities and sports organized by Help Us Help volunteers. Baby Care Initiative







Many past program participants contact *Help Us Help* when they were starting families to ask for support. As a result, in 2014, *Help Us Help* packaged and mailed gently used baby items donated in Canada to these families-in-need to help curb some of the costs that come with having a child. Requests and demand continued to grow, and, in turn, *Help Us Help* started: *The Baby Care Initiative*.

Help us Help plans to launch a platform where all the families who have received help through the Baby Care Initiative can share insight, ask questions, and recycle their items with other group members. Program participants will be invited to attend seminars throughout the year where they will be able to learn more about the family unit and child care. Parents will have access to a paediatric nurse for check ups and to answer any questions that may arise.

Mariana's Story

Mariana Mykhortova was born in 1994 in Zakarpatska oblast in Ukraine. Mariana endured many hardships at a very young age when her father suddenly passed away leaving her mother alone while struggling with addiction. Due to her mother's depression and alcohol abuse, Mariana was removed from her mother's care and placed in Perechynska Residential School.

Mariana met her husband Vasyl while in the orphanage, and once they graduated they decided to start a family of their own. The couple share three beautiful children, Nastia - 7, Bohdan - 5, and Andriy - 1. Mariana has been a part of the *Help Us Help* family since 2007 when she attended her first Winter Camp.

To date, Mariana and her family have received 3 parcels weighing a total of 68kg. The packages included: educational materials, hygiene products, clothing, household items and other humanitarian aid items.

Introducing: "We Are Capable"

As part of our Scholars Program, **Kostiantyn (Kostya) Halak** (Director of *Help Us Help UA*'s Educational and Social Programs for Persons with Disabilities) has launched an essential program that supports individuals with disability status in Ukraine in their continued education. The purpose of the initiative is to create equitable opportunities for this group of vulnerable people.



In the weeks leading up to the launch, Kostya and the team at Help Us Help UA led a seminar titled "Everyone is Capable" at various universities across Ukraine to raise awareness about the Scholars Program and the new initiative "We are Capable". In total, 10 students have been accepted into the program, and are looking forward to participating in all aspects of it.

Meet Help Us Help UA's newest staff member



Kostiantyn Halak was born in Zaporizhzhia, Ukraine. Born with a disability, he grew up an orphan in Oleshkiv Residential School. Throughout his formal studies, Kostya majored in Accounting and Auditing, graduating from the University of Economics and Law "KROK" in Kyiv. During this time, he worked as an accountant at the university in the National Assembly of People with Disabilities of Ukraine. In 2019, he successfully defended his PhD dissertation on "Accounting for the costs of socially oriented activities of economic entities". After completing his PhD, he worked as an assistant rector for social communications at the University of Economics and Law "KROK". We are excited to welcome Kostya to Help Us Help UA as Director of Educational and Social Programs for Persons with Disabilities.

Kyiv Scholarship Retreat November 6-7, 2021




2019 - 2020 Scholar's Retreat

committees around the world.





Mental Health Hub

Mental Health Hub is an initiative created for Scholars that provides monthly group psychology workshops and individual consultations to any current Scholar, alumni or past camp participant. This program teaches Scholars on the importance of mental health and provides the necessary support for individuals. The Mental Health Hub is run by two professionally trained psychologists, Tetiana Sirenko and Lyubava Kazmirchuk. We believe that having access to mental health support is important and for that reason all participants have access to individual sessions with Tetiana and Liyubava whenever they need additional support or someone to speak to.

The Mental Health Hub is set to run until Viacheslav Povsha and Kostiantyn the end of 2021.


Online Education Portal

We are pleased to announce that *Help Us Help* and *Help Us Help UA* have begun working on a new project titled "Empowering Vulnerable Youth in Ukrainian Residential Institutions and Orphanages Through Online and In-Person Life-Skills Training Programs and Workshops" targeting able-bodied and disabled graduates from the institutional care system.

Ukraine has among the highest number of children living in orphanages/residential institutions in Europe (~100,000) with approximately 12,000 graduating each academic year. Upon leaving the institutions, most lack the skills and resources to transition into safe, independent living.

The institutional care system in Ukraine is not designed to look after parentless and neglected children's best interests and has limited resources to prepare them for the future. Graduates transitioning to independent living do not feel prepared to navigate challenges in life once they are no longer cared for by the state.

The goal of this project is to provide technical assistance to disadvantaged youth in Ukraine to live a financially sustainable and healthy lifestyle.



We will do this through the creation of knowledge products and tools which includes a curriculum that incorporates various workshops that prepare Ukraine's vulnerable youth for a financially independent and productive life in their community and civil society. The curriculum will include 2 courses (A Life-skills, Health and Wellbeing Course and Pre-Adulthood Course) with various modules that will be developed and made available on an online platform for vulnerable children to access anytime. The project will be implemented across 12 cities in 12 Oblasts across Ukraine.

Although still in the beginning stages, Help Us Help and Help Us Help UA are excited to announce that we have received funding from Canadian Fund for Local Initiatives, the US Ukraine Foundation and Buduchnist Credit Union, allowing for the implementation of the project to finally begin.
